Driving directions to School from hotels:	<p>NECI's administrative building Harris Hall is located at 56 College Street, Montpelier, VT 05602. Betsy's B&B is the closest accommodation to the school and is within walking distance. From the B&B, walk up East State Street to the corner of College Street, where Harris Hall is located.</p> <p>The Capitol Plaza Hotel is located on State Street in downtown Montpelier, and you may either walk up State Street and then continue up East State Street to the corner of East State Street and College Street, or follow the same direction by car.</p> <p>The Inn at Montpelier is located on Main Street in downtown Montpelier, and you may walk from there to the intersection of Main Street and East State Street and then walk up the hill to the corner of East State Street and College Street.</p> <p>From the Econolodge, you will drive towards downtown Montpelier on Northfield Street, turning into Main Street and then take a right turn onto East State Street and go up until you reach the intersection of East State Street and College Street.</p>		

	<p>From the Hilltop Inn, you will go across Paine Turnpike on Fisher Road, and then make a right turn onto Berlin Street. At the bottom of Berlin Street make a slight left onto River Street and then a right turn onto Main Street. Take a right turn on East State Street and go up the hill to the intersection of East State Street and College Street.</p> <p>From the Comfort Inn, you will make go straight onto Berlin Street. At the bottom of Berlin Street make a slight left onto River Street and then a right turn onto Main Street. Take a right turn on East State Street and go up the hill to the intersection of East State Street and College Street.</p>
Suggested airport for arrival:	<p>The best airport for arrival is Burlington, Vermont (BTV).</p> <p>Manchester, NH can be used as an alternate arrival airport, but it is a longer drive to Montpelier (approx. 2 ½ - 3 hours)</p>
Suggested ground transportation:	<p>Transportation from BTV to Montpelier can be either by taxi or by Greyhound bus, which typically runs 4 times a day from Burlington to Montpelier. Click here to view their schedule. Rental Cars available at Burlington Airport location as well.</p>
Items to bring:	<p>Please bring three (3) chef coats and your knife kit from Level 1 Summer Institute.</p>
What to wear:	<p>Checkered or solid dark pants (no denim). Kitchen safe shoes covering the entire foot. White t-shirts. Black or white socks above the ankle. NECI will provide apron, side towel and cap.</p>
Miscellaneous Information:	<p>Vermont summer weather tends to be sunny and warm without being overly hot and humid most of the time. Evenings can be cool, so a light jacket or sweatshirt is recommended. We also recommend sturdy shoes for sightseeing and excursions.</p>
